The purpose of this information sheet is to allow you to view all modules connected to the Qualification, optional and core.

You should print this sheet out and then continue to the next step where your registration will take place.

It is your responsibility to ensure that you register correctly.

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- 1.** The Maximum amount of modules you can register for in one academic year is 4.
- 2.** You may only register for a post foundation module in a subject if you have successfully passed the foundation module e.g. to register for HIS3 or any post-foundation History module you must have successfully completed HIS1 (or have been granted an exemption from the HIS1 module).
- 3.** You may select no more than two modules from the same subject in any academic year.

**4.** You cannot take two even or odd numbered modules in the same subject in the one year e.g. you cannot register for LIT3 and LIT5 in the same year.

**4.1** The following modules count as even numbered modules: PY200: Social and Organisational Psychology, PY230: Cognitive Psychology and Biopsychology, PY310: Abnormal and Counselling Psychology, SC300: Sociology of Health & Illness, PH220: Philosophy of Education, Teaching, Pedagogy and Practice, PH200: What can I know? Philosophy of Knowledge, SC200: Sociology of the Life Course.

**4.2** The following Psychology modules count as odd numbered modules: PY100: What is Psychology?, PY210: Developmental and Educational Psychology and for Philosophy: PH310: Philosophy and Religion: Historical and Contemporary Relationships.

**5.** It is advisable for students who wish to register for HIS5 to not take this module along with HIS6. This module requires students to complete a research paper which requires a high level of commitment

**6.** Students must have previously completed at least four History modules before registering for HIS6.

**7.** It is advisable for students to have completed SC100, SC200 and SOC3A before registering for SOC5B which is an advanced level module.

**8.** PHIL6, LIT6 and HIS6: Please note these are advanced level modules and involve the completion of a dissertation. This type of module requires a high level of commitment and therefore students should carefully consider registering for this module along with other modules. Many students find it desirable to take this type of module on it's own, or with one other module (feasibility of taking this module in combination with other modules will of course depend on the capability of the student and the amount of time the student can dedicate to their studies.
