

Professional Doctorate in Elite Performance (Sport): Overseas Applicant Agreement

Applicants to the **Professional Doctorate in Elite Performance (Sport) (DELITE)**, who indicate their intention to reside abroad during the course of their studies, are asked to confirm they agree to the requirements outlined below. Please complete this agreement and include it as part of the application supplemental documentation via the CRM Application Portal.

The **Professional Doctorate in Elite Performance (Sport) (DELITE)** is a part-time 240 credit programme, comprising a 60-credit research development element and a 180-credit research thesis. The DProfElite is a flexible, blended learning programme which will exploit the working context of the students by supporting them to develop evidence-based solutions to their 'real world' workplace problems from across the sporting landscape and the part-time nature of the course has been specifically designed so that it can be available to professionals from all over the world, to fit with the demands of full-time employment while also enabling students contextualise their learning within their professional context.

Cognisant of the challenges associated with part-time and blended learning, especially for busy professionals in demanding environments, the teaching, delivery and supervision elements of the DELITE have been carefully considered for both home and international students.

Taught elements align to the "Principles for Quality Assurance of DCU E-learning & Blended Provision" and the research component has been designed to align to the University's guidance in respect of remote supervision of research students.

Requirements

In this context, applicants who indicate that they will reside abroad are asked to confirm that they can meet the requirements of:

- On-campus attendance for 2 learning blocks in Year 1 and Year 2 of the programme.
- In keeping with the Academic Regulations for Postgraduate Degrees by Research & Thesis, attend viva voce examinations in person in Dublin City University.

If applicants are accepted onto this programme, then a more detailed remote supervision agreement will be agreed with the student and their supervisor prior to the student beginning their studies.
