### 3. Course Presentations

The presentations will cover course content, choices within degrees, differences between similar degree courses, work placements and career prospects. There will be some University Taster Lectures/Workshops taking place throughout the day offering you a real life glimpse of university life.

### 5. Campus Tours

If you are considering studying at DCU, it is important that you get a feel for the campus. It's a wonderful place and it could be your home from home for the next three or four years. Highlights include student accommodation\*, our award winning sports centre and the beautiful three-storey John and Aileen O' Reilly Library. Tours will depart from the "DCU Letters" in front of the Helix every half hour starting at 10.30am. The tour will take approximately 30 minutes with the last tour departing at 2pm. Tours of the Sports Gym will take place on the hour from 11am until 2pm. Please go to reception in the Sports Complex (#10).
