## **1. Information Points**

The Open Day information area is located in the library (see campus map on page 5). Look out for our DCU Student Ambassadors (wearing "Can I Help?" red high vis jackets).

# 2. Parents/Guardians Talk

Do you have questions about university? Join Student Support and Development for a special advisory session on the application process and on how to offer support and advice during and after enrolment. This session will take place in D Block room D211 (#4) at 11.15 am.

# **3. Course Presentations**

Presentations will cover course content, choices within degrees, differences between similar degree courses, placements and career prospects. Each presentation will be approximately 30 minutes in duration. So, for example, if you are interested in attending the Bachelor of Education talk, go to room G114 in the G Block (#7) at 10am or 12pm.

# 4. University Taster Sessions

There will be two Taster Sessions taking place, one on Primary Placement as well as an interactive session on STEM in early education. There will also be a talk on teaching the subjects Applied Technology (Junior Cycle) and Technology (Senior Cycle). We would encourage you to attend the session relevant to the course or courses you are interested in.

# **5. Campus Tours**

It is important that you get a feel for the DCU St Patrick's Campus. Student Ambassadors will provide guided tours of the campus at regular intervals throughout the day. Highlights include the four-storey Cregan Library with its impressive views of Dublin, LEGO studio, and student accommodation\*. Tours of the DCU St Patrick's campus will depart from the reception desk outside of the Cregan Library at 10am, 11am, 12pm and 1pm – the tour will take approximately 30 minutes.
